Over the Coffee by Rev. Leigh Brown

Earlier this year the Nordeast clergy (Max, Sarah, Susan and myself) met to discuss our Wednesday night Lenten worship at Coffee Shop Northeast. Coffee fuels our creativity! We decided on the theme *Bodies* to reflect on our (and Christ's) embodied nature, and to focus the five services on body awareness, diversity, aging, intimacy and community.

Pastor Max agreed to lead the service on aging. I wondered where he would go with this subject. The importance of learning to love wrinkles and dry skin? The assurance that God is with us as we live with new aches and pains? The fact that aging is like nature's Sabbath – slowing us down to enjoy what we have created in our lives?



But the focus of Max's message was far more wonderful. He talked about the importance of relationships in the church across all ages – how many of us were encouraged and mentored in the faith by someone older than ourselves, and how all of us have that opportunity to be that mentor today for someone new to the faith. Max pointed out that church is one of the few places where all generations still gather together. And generations need to gather together – this has been true throughout the centuries. We have something different and essential to offer each other in all the stages of our lives.

This is the nature of our Faith Church community – we are a neighborhood church for folks of all ages. Isn't that great? This is the perfect place for intergenerational community! We are small enough to know one another, and to know each of our children and youth. We are strong in character, wise in experience, and inclusive in spirit. We can, individually and collectively, serve as friends and mentors to others in the Christian way of life. Children, youth and young adults need our love and support in this complicated and conflicted world, and we need their hopes and dreams for the future.

We have lost a part of our nature over the years. From 2005 until 2012, the number of children in our Sunday School decreased by 73%. Part of the reason for this is demographic – in the 2010 census, St Anthony had the highest per capita senior population in Minnesota for communities of 5,000 or more. Part of the reason is cultural – fewer people are attending church. And part of the reason is comfort – when we are comfortable we are slow to change. We want church to be like it was when we were young, even though in our hearts we know that our world is always changing. Needs and preferences, including those in worship and Christian education, change with each generation.

For the last two years a mission and vision team, guided by our lay leader Janet Johnson, has met to lift up our strengths and our dreams for this church. The strengths were easy to see; the dreams at first were vague. But the Holy Spirit was moving and one vision became clear — we are called to be an intergenerational church. It's our nature. Out of this vision a new passion and commitment to reach out to children and families is growing at Faith Church, and we are calling it *Project Future!* Our community is changing. New families are moving in. We have the opportunity to be intergenerational once more. We long for it, and we *need* it. Families (including church families) look after each other through the generations, and the way we hold on to our faith is to share our faith. We can reach out to be a church family for so many people who have never known what it means to be the Body of Christ — to listen to each other, pray together, lift and encourage each other, help out in times of need and celebrate in times of joy.

You are an important part of this community. *Project Future!* is about *all* of us, and there will be plenty of ways to be a part of it. This summer we will host a cookout as part of the community Feed My Starving Children event for all ages. From August 3-7 Nordeast UM churches will host Eco-Kids Camp again for grades 3-5, and we are making room for even more kids! The camp base will be at Faith Church this year. Other outreach events for children and families are in the works as well. The refreshing, energizing breeze of the Holy Spirit is moving through Faith Church!

Carbon Footprint Reduction




Here is an update on what we are doing to reduce our carbon footprint in trying to meet the goals set forth by the Annual Conference in their resolution approved last year.





And it will surely render a smile upon your face.



holy sacraments, and to order the life of the Church."



Through ordination, both elders and deacons are set apart for servant leadership in The United Methodist Church and represent Christ in their work and in their life. This does not mean they are without flaws, as you well know! It does mean, however, that they have been called by God, the church has affirmed that call, and the church authorizes the ordained deacon or elder to lead the people of God in their ministry and mission in the world.

Most people in the church are familiar with the work of the elder. Elders are typically pastors of congregations, called to preach the Word of God, administer the sacraments, and order the life of the church. Deacons are called to ministries of compassion and justice, creating a bridge between the church and the world. Deacons that serve in the church are looking outward to the needs and hurts of the world. And deacons that serve in settings outside the church represent the church in the world and witness to the presence of Christ in that place. Often deacons have a specialized ministry such as faith formation, community organizing, counseling, music, etc. There are currently approximately 230 elders in the Minnesota Annual Conference, but only 19 deacons. (And three of us have served at Faith UMC!)

Frequently Asked Questions:

Aren't you already ordained? No. In the United Methodist Church, the journey to ordination is a long process of discernment! In 2012 I was commissioned as a deacon and licensed for that ministry. During this three-year "probationary" period, the church has continued to evaluate me and my ministry.

Does this mean you will get your own church? No. Deacons rarely serve as the sole pastor of a congregation. Pastoring a church is the role of the elder who is authorized to administer the Holy Sacraments and order the life of the church.

Does this mean they will move you to another congregation? Probably not. Unlike elders, deacons are responsible for finding their own work. We then request that the bishop appoint us to that place.

Does this mean that you will lead communion? No. Elders are tasked with administering the sacraments, including baptism and holy communion. Deacons (and lay people) assist elders with the sacraments. Deacons can officiate at weddings and funerals.
