Antiracism Study Dialogue Circle

Christ is our peace. He made both Jews and Gentiles into one group. With his body, he broke down the barrier of hatred that divided us. He canceled the detailed rules of the Law so that he could create one new person out of the two groups, making peace... So now you are no longer strangers and aliens. Rather, you are fellow citizens with God's people, and you belong to God's household. (Ephesians 2:14-19)

The apostle Paul reminds the congregation in Ephesus that Christ breaks down barriers, bringing people together as citizens of the kin-dom of God, no longer strangers or aliens.

In our day, we are also experiencing barriers between groups of people. We are all part of a legacy of racism which can be seen in our regulations and laws, social norms and practices, and in our decision-making. In Christ, we see that God wants to break down these barriers that divide us.

This fall we have an opportunity to host and to participate in an antiracism study dialogue circle at Faith UMC. This circle will meet every Saturday morning from September 9 through November 11 from 8:00 am to 12:30 pm.

Yes, this is a significant investment of time! And yes, participants must commit to coming to all the sessions (and commit to doing the reading if they must miss a session). You might think this is too much to ask. But would you think that if you were a young Muslim girl getting accused by her schoolmates of being a terrorist, or if you were a black man getting stopped by the police? The goals of the dialogue circle are to help us think critically about the racism present within our culture, understand how it shapes our relationships, and learn how to cross barriers of difference to form friendships, coalitions, and networks. It will help us take action to dismantle racism and create a more just and equitable society.

There are several ways that you can support this effort:

- 1) Sign up to participate in the antiracism dialogue circle with Rev. Diane and Rev. Susan by going to our website at www.faithumchurch.com. The cost is \$365 per person, plus \$40 for the manual. Please contact Rev. Susan Mullin if you need a scholarship to attend.
- 2) Gather a group of friends to provide breakfast on one or more Saturdays at 8:00 AM. The church can reimburse up to \$100 in grocery costs. Please sign up in the Commons.
- 3) Volunteer to provide childcare (if needed) on Saturday mornings. Talk to Rev. Susan Mullin or Jan Pappin if you are interested.

Living Stones Pilgrimage:

The purpose of this trip is to learn about life in Palestine/Israel from Christian, Jewish, and Muslim residents of the country. As we journey to Bethlehem, Jericho, Jordan River, Nazareth, Sea of Galilee, Jacob's Well, and the many sites of Jerusalem, we will also visit with local residents and community leaders.

This is an 11-day journey leaving on Monday, January 15th.

Cost starts at \$3308, which includes airfare from New York and most meals. Additional costs include airfare from Minneapolis to New York and optional travel insurance.

Annual Conference 2017



Rev. Susan Mullin and Mark & Tricia Grimes will be attending the Annual Conference from June 20-22 at the River's Edge Convention Center in St. Cloud on behalf of Faith Church. Did you know that visitors are welcome? There is no charge to attend the camp revival (June 20 from 6:00-9:00 pm in Lake George Park) or the Celebration of Life in Ministry worship service on Wednesday from 7:00-9:00 pm. It costs \$25 if you want to attend as a visitor for a day. And if you don't want to make the drive to St. Cloud, many of the conference sessions will be livestreamed. The theme of the 2017 Annual Conference is "Encounter the Spirit: Live Expectantly." We will focus on what it means to be an Acts 2 church and to fully claim our identity as people of Pentecost—filled with the Holy Spirit and called out into the world to share our faith and be the presence of Christ to others. We will explore the importance of being evangelistic disciples and sharing our stories with others—and just like the earliest followers of Jesus in Acts 2, we'll come together for teaching, breaking bread, fellowship, and prayer.

The three-day conference session is a time for Minnesota United Methodists to worship and enjoy fellowship, learn from teaching sessions, seek God's guidance as we make decisions about ministry direction, determine budgets, ordain and commission clergy, and receive the bishop's clergy appointments.

The guest speaker at annual conference is Rev. Junius B. Dotson—former pastor of a 3,500-member multi-campus church in Wichita, Kansas and currently the general secretary of Discipleship Ministries. Before starting his current role, he helped launch the #NoFergusonHere effort to bridge police and community divisions in Wichita, and his work on the Kansas State Sentencing Commission resulted in changes in the sentencing guidelines for persons facing incarceration. "We must shift the conversation from fixing churches to reaching people for Christ, not to save or preserve the institution, but because we are committed to living out of the biblical mandate that Jesus gave us, called the Great Commission," Dotson said when being installed as general secretary. In Minnesota, he'll deliver talks about the "why" and "how" of evangelism and provide both inspiration and practical ideas for sharing our God stories.
