This July and August there will not be an Art & Soul. We resume again on September 20, 2014.

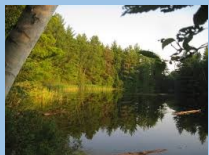

Over the Coffee *by Rev. Leigh Brown*



The characteristics of an energetic, healthy, growing church have changed. Fewer people attend church. Church is no longer the place where people go to “make contacts.” In addition, the program-based churches of the 1950s, 60s and 70s are no longer the model for a vital church. Only very large churches are able to survive as program churches now. The number of non-profit organizations has greatly increased, and there are many programs and activities available today outside of the church. Many of them even have a spiritual or moral component. Only very large churches have the money, staff and volunteers to offer programs that can compete with these.

So what attracts people to church today? Here’s a surprise – it isn’t worship style. Although a band definitely helps! It isn’t even necessarily *worship*. Two things are critical.

First, a vital congregation is a congregation whose members are actively seeking to live a more Spirit-led life. This can be difficult for congregations, as when churches were places to network the key was to put on a good appearance. Seekers are looking for a place to honestly share their joys and struggles and questions, and grow in spiritual maturity. They are truly searching for a more God-centered life. I think the closest example we have to illustrate this at faith is the “What Are You Praying About?” Sunday school class. It is hard to get members of that class to disperse and come to worship! They share their vulnerabilities and struggles. They talk about their kids. They laugh a lot. I know this because they meet next to my office! I can’t hear what they’re saying, but I can hear them laughing. Hopefully they’re not telling pastor jokes. Members of this class have bonded. They pray for each other during the week. They talk about their faith.

Second, for small urban churches a key to vitality is a signature ministry. A signature ministry is something the community knows you for – as in “oh, that’s the church that does _____.” There can be one or two at most. Here’s the key – the signature ministry cannot be about taking care of one another or anything that happens within the congregation. A signature ministry reaches outside the church doors. It can be anything from health care to advocating for racial justice. It must be something for which the congregation is passionate and personally involved. Similarly, it cannot be the pastor’s passion – the congregation will far outlast the pastor! Finally, a signature ministry cannot be a program (such as ASP) as all churches have such programs. It must be lived out in an ongoing way.

I have been sniffing around for the hidden seeds of a signature ministry at Faith since my arrival. I have sensed passion in two areas – Reconciling Ministry and the environment. This is exciting because the Reconciling Ministry’s message is uniquely held by Faith among St Anthony’s churches, and speaks to the fears or perceptions seekers have that churches are judgmental or bigoted. It is the civil rights movement of this time. It’s exciting because the environment is truly the most compelling issue of our time, one that will impact all others – economic security, hunger, violence, health. We are on the precipice of minimizing damage vs. acting too late. The church universal has been sadly detached from the environmental movement. Like every institution that exists, we have played a role in the degradation of the environment. Since we believe that the earth was created by God (yes, God invented evolution!) and indeed is a part of God, it seems that we should be leading the cause for saving it. So what do you think are Faith’s potential signature ministries? Have you seen something that I have missed? Projects that members of the group will take on may include electrical work, installing drywall, painting, and various other tasks as requested based on the collective skill levels of participants. This is an amazing opportunity to be the hands and feet of Jesus while helping people rebuild their lives and their homes. The goal is to take 60 people on the trip. Those who went on last year's Sandy relief mission trip loved their experience and returned home changed because of it. Don't miss out!
