About Lent and Easter 2017

“As we travel through Lent and Easter, we find ourselves on a journey of discovery of God’s presence throughout history and in our lives today.

“Lent is usually a somber season, denoted by the color purple – often referred to as an ‘I’m sorry’ color. Certainly, much of the mood of Lent is of growing sorrow, and growing awareness of the inevitability of Good Friday. Yet, interestingly, the scripture readings this season evoke a sense of light. There is an increasing sense that people become aware of new ways to see, new ways to understand, and that the light of Christ is growing around them. Consequently, part of this season will involve the growing of light throughout the season; the contrast then becomes all the richer when these lights are extinguished on Palm/Passion Sunday.

“In the Easter season, the light returns as we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Yet there is an odd slowness to this – the Sunday after Easter we read of the disciples in hiding out of fear of the religious authorities, and of Thomas coming even more slowly to a realization that Christ is risen. We read of disciples travelling in uncertainty, only recognizing Jesus in the breaking of the bread. Yet the light does grow, the faith does grow, and the church does grow. Indeed, throughout this season we begin to capture a sense of the unstoppable nature of the Christian faith. While the authorities try to squelch it by killing Stephen, the light only shines brighter. Faith in the risen Christ is contagious!”

The name of our congregation changed over the years from Second Swedish to Ebenezer to Faith, and the name of our denomination changed from Methodist Episcopal to Methodist to United Methodist, and we are a congregation that has thrived through all these changes.

Many events are part of our celebration this year:

- **January** pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Sunday sermons now include photos and stories from the trip.
- **April 30** worship and luncheon with former pastors and their families. Invite family and former church members to this time of reconnection. Our Communications Team has placed pictures of Faith's former pastors on a display in the hallway between the church office and the music room.
- **October 15** worship with Bishop Bruce Ough preaching. We have one of the best bishops in United Methodism right here in Minnesota and we warmly welcome him among us in our quasiquicentennial year.
- One of our **November** worship services will celebrate our 60th anniversary as Faith Church. We became Faith Methodist Church in 1957, and in 1968, when the Evangelical United Brethren (EUB) and Methodist Churches merged, we became Faith United Methodist Church.
- In **December**, we will celebrate the founding of our original congregation, Second Swedish Methodist Episcopal Church, Minneapolis.

We have a great history. We are a congregation that has reached new people with the good news of Jesus Christ each time we moved to a new location. We are a church that offers avenues for both nurture of our congregation and outreach to our community and world. We celebrate the present and say "yes" to God's future.

Anti-Racism Initiative

“Surely we aren’t blind, are we?” – John 9:40

One of our texts during Lent is the story of a man who was blind from birth. Jesus spits on the ground and takes this dirt/saliva mixture and smears it on the man’s eyes and tells him to go wash in the Pool of Siloam. The man does this and then he sees. On one level, this is a miracle story of physical healing. On another level, it brings up questions of sight versus blindness. Some of the Pharisees engaged in discussion about this incident end up asking the question, “Surely we aren’t blind, are we?”

In what ways are we blind to what is happening in our communities? The deaths of black men at the hands of the police in recent years have caught our attention: Michael Brown, Freddie Gray, Jamar Clark, Philando Castile. How do we learn to “see” racism at work in our culture and in the structure and organization of our communities? How do we respond? What is the role of the church?

In December 2016, Faith was notified that we are the recipient of an “Investing in Congregations Grant” of \$2,500 from the Minnesota Annual Conference. This grant will allow us to host a ½ day workshop this spring and a ten-week Anti-Racism Study Dialogue Circle in the fall.

- The half-day workshop on “Discerning Whiteness” will be held on Saturday morning, April 8 from 8:00-12:30. This workshop is designed to help us see the pervasiveness of racialized assumptions, expectations, images, values, and beliefs in our culture and how these socially-constructed identities shape our sense of reality.
- The ten week Anti-racism Study Dialogue Circle (ASDIC) will offer a way to better understand the ways race and racism operate in our lives. The goal for those who participate in the study circle is that they will attain a greater clarity of thinking, strength of relationship, and effectiveness of action in addressing systemic racism. The study dialogue circle will be held on Saturday mornings from 8:00-12:30, September 9 through November 11. Participants are asked to commit to attending all ten sessions.

Many people in St. Anthony Village are hungry and thirsting for the opportunity to engage in dialogue around racism. Please invite your friends, colleagues, and neighbors to participate with you in these events. We also need volunteers to help prepare and serve breakfast (eleven Saturdays!) and to provide child care if needed. If you have questions or want more information, please contact Rev. Susan.

Simpson Shelter Meal

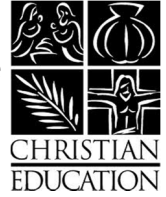

Kids Connect

Our curriculum this year is called “Seasons of the Spirit Fusion.” Fusion is a good description, because we are fusing worship and Kids Connect—we study the same Bible passage in worship and in our classes downstairs. Here are some suggestions for Lent from our Seasons of the Spirit curriculum:



Lenten Stones: During Lent, we journey with Jesus toward Jerusalem, and we also take our own journey of faith. Many people pick up stones when they travel to remember the places they have been. As a family, decorate some small stones and place them in a pattern (a line or a spiral or some other shape) to remind yourselves of the journey of Lent.

Lenten Offering Box: Make a slot in the top of a box or container. Decorate it any way you like, perhaps using scraps of tissue paper and painting them on with diluted glue. Think about giving up something for Lent – something that costs money (like going out to eat, going to a movie, or special treats). Then each week put the money that you save into the container. At the end of Lent, donate the money to a project or cause of your choice.

Lenten Blessing: Light a candle during your mealtimes in Lent. At the end of the meal, one person can extinguish the candle, and say “The light has not gone, the light continues on, lit in our hearts by God’s love.” Take turns giving the blessing each time you eat together.
